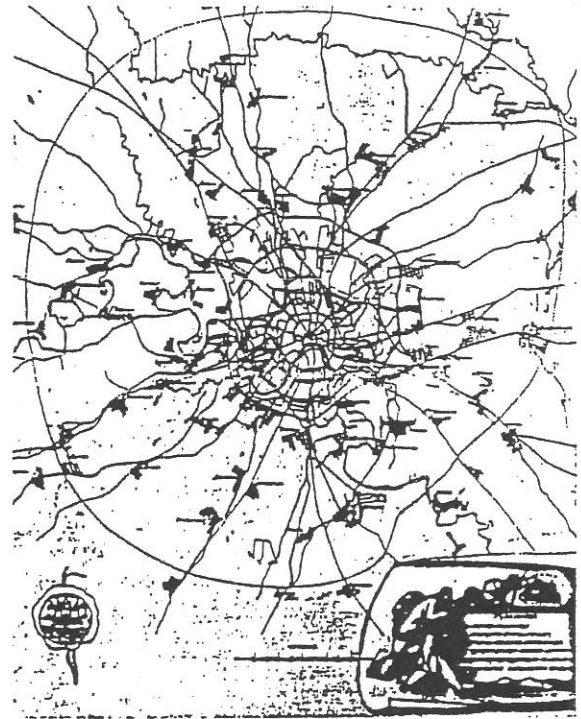
121. Mossovet, plan for the Moscow area, 1918.

1. existing city;
2. existing railways;
3. projected railways;
4. projected electric lines;
5. zones of economic importance, with electrified industrial zones, satellite cities, etc.

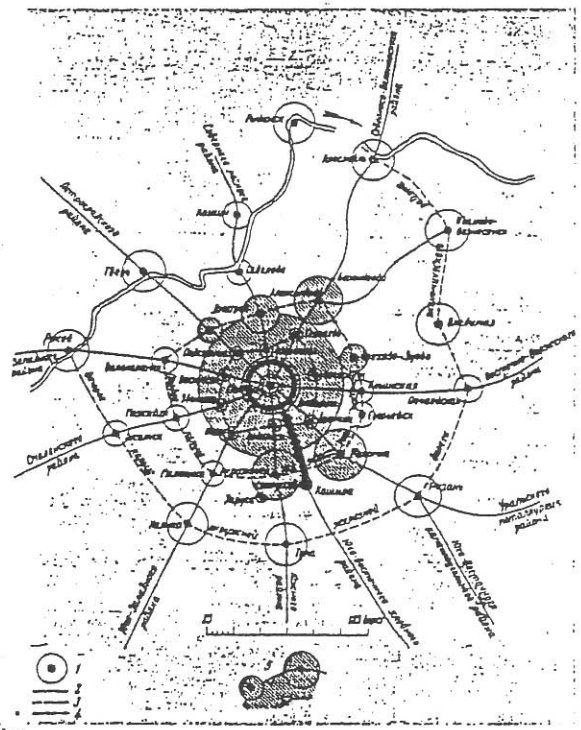
MOSSOVET

SAKULIN

- "Triple bound of satellite cities"*
- ring-shaped railroad acts as limit to urban expansion, beyond which are forests, parks, agriculture etc
 - rejects Howard's recommendation for the sake of a plan of rapid industrialization.
